Research interests

I avail myself of the typical methodology used by historians of political thought. Accordingly, political terms and expressions are analysed in wider contexts (not only political and institutional, but also cultural and anthropological contexts). I worked in depth on Thomas Hill Green, Leonard T. Hobhouse and J.A. Hobson. Starting from British New Liberalism, I investigated Italian Liberalsocialismo through Aldo Capitini and Guido Calogero and the liberal socialism of Carlo Rosselli. I also worked on the making of the relationship between socialism and christianity at the outset of the XX Century, with a special attention to the so-called Modernism.
