



Michele Siri is a full professor of business law at the University of Genoa and teaches corporate law, financial market law and insurance law at the Department of Law. His main research interests include European capital market regulation, sustainable finance, investor protection and the regulation of insurance and financial intermediaries.

He is also an adjunct professor in financial market law in the course Economics and Management of Financial Institutions and Markets at Luigi Bocconi University. He is a lecturer at the EBI LLM in *EU Banking and Financial Regulation* at the Frankfurt School of Finance & Management and in the LLM in *European Banking Law* at the University of Bologna.

Since 2017, he has been the holder of the Jean Monnet Chair EUFIMAR (*European Union Financial and Insurance Markets Regulation*) dedicated to cross-sectoral regulation of the EU financial and insurance sector. He is the director (since 2020) of the *Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on EU Sustainable Finance and Law* (EUSFiL) and a member of the teaching board of the national PhD in Sustainable Development and Climate Change (PhD SDC) at IUSS PAVIA (since 2021).

He is an academic fellow of EBI - *European Banking Institute* in Frankfurt, an academic member of ECGI European Corporate Governance Institute in Brussels and of the *Community of Practice in Financial Research* (CoPFiR) established by the Joint Research Center of the European Commission. At the University of Zurich, he is an academic member of SUSFIN - *Research Network for Sustainable Finance* (since 2020). He is a member of the scientific committee of Nedcommunity, the Italian association of non-executive and independent directors (from 2019).

He is Chairman (since 2021) of the *Joint Board of Appeal of the European Supervisory Authorities* (EBA, ESMA and EIOPA), of which he has been a permanent member (since 2018) at the nomination of the European Insurance and Pensions Authority (EIOPA). Previously, he was a permanent member of the *Consultative Working Group for Investor Protection and Intermediaries Standing Committee* (IPIISC) upon designation of ESMA, the European Securities and Markets Authority (2017-2018). In Italy, he is an academic member of the advisory board of COMI, *Comitato degli Operatori di Mercato e degli Investitori*, established by CONSOB, the public authority responsible for supervising the Italian financial markets, for consulting the stakeholders (since 2019).

He has long-standing experience advising on European capital markets law and regulation. He specialises in the regulatory profiles of the activity of financial and insurance companies, both concerning the provision of services and the corporate governance of financial institutions. He has acted and continues to serve as a supervisory committee member in extraordinary administration or compulsory administrative liquidation proceedings. He has acquired over twenty-five years of experience in corporate governance systems in the financial, insurance and social security sectors, where he acted as an independent director or chair of the board of statutory auditors.
