In the course of forty years of uninterrupted **teaching activity**, at Milan-IULM (**1986-2002**), at Macerata (**2002-2018**), at Genoa (**2019** -) as part of the teaching of Romance Philology, held first on a tenure track and then on a tenure track, he has held, in addition to institutional and seminar courses, monographic courses on the lyricism of the troubadours, on textual criticism (the nature of the medieval book and problems with the edition of the *Voyage de Charlemagne*), on comedy and laughter in medieval texts, on narrative genres and parody in Romance literature, on the *Roman de Renart*, on the relations between philology, folklore and cultural history, on tri-functional ideology, on the forms of the tale, on medieval theatre; He has also taught in the Laboratory of Comparative Euro-American Literature and in the PhD programme in Comparative Languages and Literature at the University of Macerata. He has always personally carried out the profit and degree **examinations** of the courses he has taught; he has directed numerous degree and PhD **theses**; he has regularly participated in the activities of university collegiate bodies and carried out the **institutional tasks** assigned to him.

He first turned his **scientific interests** to aspects of the theory of literature, studying intertextuality and parody (with particular attention to texts of Old French literature, such as *Trubert's fabliau* and the *Audigier* heroicomic poem) and the application of the methods of the semiology of culture (M.M. Bachtin, Ju.M. Lotman) to the Romance Middle Ages; he has

prepared a new edition with an Italian translation of the Voyage de Charlemagne in Old French (12th century), a work to which he has devoted several studies both philological and of literary and cultural history: In particular, he has extrapolated the motif of convivial boasting, the historical and anthropological roots of which he has highlighted in the epic and chivalric Romance tradition (French and Italian), in the Germanic world (Edda and Beowulf) and in the Slavic world (Russian bylini), then compared with the epic of the Narti (Ossetians) and with the Greek symposium, and verified again in Provençal poetry; the research on the motif of the chivalrous vaunts has also made it possible to deepen certain problems of methodology (choice of documentation, criteria for classifying cultural elements); these new results have been brought together in a monograph (2010), preceded by a new critical edition of the Voyage de Charlemagne (2007) that takes account of the latest discoveries on the manuscript; the area of privileged interest remains the dynamics of the relations between different 'levels of culture' in society (in this case medieval) and its modes of manifestation in (literary) texts; he has been working for some time on animal literature and in particular on ancient French zooepics (Roman de Renart), of which he has prepared an Italian edition and translation of the most representative texts in three volumes (1998, 20044; 2012; 2021); in particular, he has discussed the ideological implications of the 19th-20th century debate between French and German critics of the Roman de Renart, analysed some of the parts (branches) of which the work is composed, and proposed some new interpretative hypotheses in relation to the presumed surfacing in it of totemic-type beliefs, he studied the intertextual relations between the branches and the relations with the ancient and medieval Aesopic tradition, re-examined the problem of the proper names of animals, tackled individual textual issues and narrative structure, as well as comparative aspects of the various redactions, and researched the use of parody and relations with folklore. The results of this research have come together in a monograph (2006), which is the first in Italian on the Roman de Renart.

The production (2001) of a monographic volume on literary parody, analysed in its semiotic, anthropological and historical aspects (with particular regard to medieval culture), together with the latest research still in progress, allowed him to delve into a number of theoretical and applicative issues (a biosocial theory of laughter, the *trickster* as archetype and as character, religious implications of transgression, etc.) that are of great interest for the elaboration of an anthropology of (literary) text, a methodological approach and a disciplinary framework virtually capable of offering new common ground for studies on literature.) that are of great interest for the elaboration of *an anthropology of the (literary) text*, a methodological approach and a disciplinary framework virtually capable of offering new common ground for studies on literature.) that are of great interest for the elaboration of *an anthropology of the (literary) text*, a methodological approach and a disciplinary framework virtually able to offer a new common ground for literature studies; in this framework, the curatorship of the Italian editions of the works of the Russian comparatist Eleazar M. A volume of essays on the theory of literature in which the outlines of an anthropology of the text are set out is published in 2024.
