## Research interests

As a scholar I specialize in textual criticism. I focused my attention initially on Juvenal, publishing critical editions, interpretative essays, translations and commentaries on his Satires. In recent years I broadened my interests to the cultural and social background of Roman Imperial Age, studying in depth the Greek and Latin school texts and teaching procedures, with special emphasis on ancient rhetoric and declamation. I am currently involved in three international research project, aimed at publishing a complete series of editions, translations and commentaries on both the Major and Lesser Declamations ascribed to Quintilian, and eventually a comprehensive edition of the Major Declamations in the Loeb Classical Library.
